AROUND INDUSTRY

Less water for SA irrigators. While the Darling River is flowing, the Murray system hasn't recovered at all. As a result inflows into the MDB have been very low. The volume of water in the basin was 14% at this time last year compared with 20% now. According to the SA Government the situation is still "bleak". System inflows for December 2007 were 225 GL and 130 GL was received in January 2008; system inflows so far during 2007-08 have been about 2 000 GL, compared to the 935 GL received for the whole of 2006-07; changes have been made to the water sharing rules; SA irrigation allocations are likely to stay at 32% based on the new water sharing rules and current inflows into the River Murray and storages; and SA is required to pay back water advanced for irrigation in 2007-08 and accumulate water for critical human needs in 2008-09 before any additional water can be allocated to irrigation allocations.

Funds flow for irrigation modernisation. In February the Federal Government awarded grants totalling \$4.6 million to fourteen irrigation water providers to develop modernisation plans for reducing water loss in the water infrastructure that they own and operate. The grants will be used to help identify and consider the range of options available to them to modernise their water delivery infrastructure. Southern Rural Water in Victoria is using its grant to study the options to replace its 90-year-old infrastructure with a modern supply system; while the North and South Burdekin Water Boards in Queensland are working together to assess their current water delivery systems and the efficiency of local water use.

Learning to spread less water further. In February, ACTEW Corporation released the outcomes from the first year of data gathering by Grass Roots, a turf and irrigation research

project looking to develop best practice watering regimes and benchmark water use requirements for turf, in particular in large open spaces. Since 2006, a school oval has been used as a research site trailing five different varieties of turf, cross-laid with different sprinkler and drip irrigation systems. A water saving of around 40% was achieved last year. To read the report go to [website](#).

NSW examines water diversions in Macquarie Marsh. After more allegations of illegal water diversions in the internationally recognised Macquarie Marshes, the NSW Government says that an audit of unauthorised banks and channels has just begun. Investigations should be finished by the end of the year.

Federal Government buys water for Murray. Minister for Water and Climate Change, Senator Penny Wong has just announced that the Federal Government will be spending \$50 million this financial year on “a down payment on the future of the River Murray”. The Government will be buying water for environmental purposes. Some in the industry are saying that the government entering the market will put pressure on water prices and push them up. Senator Wong’s response is that the government will be sensitive to this possibility when entering the market.

Burnett Farmers Get Boost to Water Allocations. Kingaroy, Upper Burnett and Boyne River farmers have plenty of reasons to smile since SunWater announced major increases in water allocations thanks to recent wet weather across the region. There have been major increases in allocation (many to 100%) in the Upper Burnett Water Supply Scheme, in the Barker Barambah Water Supply Scheme (from 0% to 46% for medium priority users) and in the Boyne and Tarong Water Supply Scheme (from 0% to 80% for medium priority users). Paradise Dam is now holding 41% of capacity, Fred Haigh 37%, Bjelke-Petersen Dam 18% Boondooma Dam 52 per cent.

Queensland water goes south. The Queensland Government says that Queensland is doing its bit to help revive the southern Murray Darling Basin. With significant rains, and flooding, having occurred recently it says that “over 2100 billion litres have flowed over the Queensland border into the southern Murray Darling Basin since late last year”. It also said that Queensland uses a very small proportion of Murray Darling water. Although 25% of the total area of the Murray Darling Basin is in Queensland, Queensland last year took only 2.6% of water extractions from the basin. In contrast, NSW took 43.3% and Victoria took over 41.6%.

AquaSpy replaces Agrilink. AquaSpy was recently launched as the rebranding of the company Agrilink. Over 10 years the company has been delivering "smart water technologies" to agriculture and the rebranding to AquaSpy better reflects the company's expansion to provide its water management solutions to the golf, turf and urban markets. The AquaSpy Group is an Australian company (headquartered in Adelaide) with subsidiaries in the US for North America and Latin America markets.
